

# GEORGIA COTTON WOMEN SCHOLARSHIP AND JOHN M. AND CONNIE H. MOBLEY

MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The John M. and Connie H. Mobley Memorial Scholarship is presented annually by the Georgia Cotton Women to the child or grandchild of an active Georgia cotton producer with priority given to children of Georgia Cotton Women members. The \$1,500 scholarship will be payable one-half each semester. This scholarship was established by the late John M. Mobley. It was continued by his wife Connie and is now carried on by their family.

The Georgia Cotton Women Scholarship is presented annually to the child or grandchild of a member of the Georgia Cotton Women. This scholarship is also in the amount of \$1,500 and payable one-half each semester. In the event there is no child or grandchild of a GCW member eligible for this scholarship, the Scholarship Committee has the discretion to the present the award to another qualified candidate.

### **SELECTION PROCESS**

- 1. A committee appointed by the President of the Georgia Cotton Women will select the recipient each year from applications received.
- 2. Applicants may be entering freshmen or rising sophomores attending or planning to attend a college in Georgia.
- 3. A minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.5 is required. The recipient must maintain a 2.5 GPA in order to receive the scholarship the following term.
- 4. Recipients should possess demonstrated leadership potential and participation in organized activities.
- 5. Disciplinary suspension of any type or failure to meet the grade point average requirement shall terminate the scholarship. The Scholarship committee may review a request for reinstatement when circumstances totally beyond the student's control occur causing termination.
- 6. The recipient should have documentation from the college stating that he/she has maintained a 2.5 GPA and is registered for classes for the following term before payment will be made for the next term. The student must maintain a minimum course load of 12 hours.
- 7. The Committee may interview the top three to five applicants before making a final decision.

## REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Two letters of recommendation are required in support of this application.
  - A. One from a high school or college teacher.
  - B. One from any source other than immediate family.
- 2. Attach a copy of your official high transcript which includes your cumulative grade point average, class rank, and, if available, your SAT or ACT score. If a rising sophomore, also include a college transcript for all colleges attended.
- 3. A <u>letter</u> from the Farm Service Agency with producer's name and cotton acreage must accompany each entry. The committee reserves the right to contact FSA to confirm information. (Do not include printouts from FSA, just a letter from FSA stating producer's <u>name and cotton acreage.)</u>
- 4. Attach an essay (no more than two pages, double-spaced) describing yourself, why you are applying for this scholarship, what financial need you have, and what your personal and professional goals are.
